GUIDED HIKES AND EXPLORATION



Our guided hiking series has something for everyone! These hikes will venture out beyond our learning garden and farm to explore the wetlands, woods, and hidden worlds that surround us. These hikes explore new topics throughout the season, so even if you've joined before, you'll learn something new as the land changes.

Guided Naturalist Hikes

Join us for guided hikes across the George Jones Farm, home to diverse biomes, plants, fungi, and wildlife. Each hike covers new topics, so sign up for the full series to keep learning. Expect a brisk pace, possible off-trail routes, and discussions on environmental issues affecting our farm, watershed, and community. Come prepared with proper footwear and layers for up to 3 miles. Hikes run rain or shine and are canceled only for severe weather.

George Jones Farm Tours

Join us to learn the history of George Jones Farm, our organization, and our growing projects. We'll cover topics like permaculture, regenerative and organic agriculture, and the farming community in Ohio. Whether you're considering volunteering or just curious, these tours offer a great introduction to the farm and our work. **Expect to walk up to 1 mile. Tours run rain or shine and are canceled only for severe weather. Wear weather-appropriate clothing; closed-toe shoes recommended.**

FARM LABS



Bring your family to the farm to explore the science behind the natural world and how food is grown. These farm labs dive into farming, gardening, and ecosystems through hands-on learning and a brief guided tour. Geared toward children and families, they're a fun way to better understand what's happening in your garden, home, and beyond.

Owl Pellet Dissection | Wednesday, June 24th, 10AM-12PM

Owls, hawks, and other birds of prey play an important role in Ohio's ecosystem and on our farm. Join farmer and naturalist Emma to explore Ohio's owls, learn about their unique digestion, and dissect your own owl pellet. We'll identify owl habitats, share tips for spotting owls at home, and discover what they've been eating.

Age Range: Family Friendly, 8+

Pre-Registration: Required. Registration closes 24 hours before event starts.

Fresh Water Fishing | Wednesday, July 15th, 3PM-6PM

This event introduces kids to fishing, pond and wetland ecosystems, and how fishing helps us understand the landscape. Come ready to get wet, wade into the ponds, learn to tie knots, and identify the fish, insects, and other critters around us.

Participants will leave with new skills and a fish field guide to keep exploring (limit 1 per household). This is a catch-and-release event. Some poles will be available, but feel free to bring your own. Fly and bobber fishing welcome. No watercraft allowed.

Fishing at GJF is limited to participants 16 and under. Those 16+ are welcome to attend and share their knowledge.

Farm Lab: Forests and Forts | Wednesday, August 5th, 10AM-12PM

Explore the woods with us to learn how animals live and survive while building your own forts and shelters. Along the way, we'll identify helpful plants and discuss survival skills. Proceeds from this Farm Lab support our conservation work and STEM education.

Flowers, Herbs, and Pollinators | Wednesday, September 22nd, 4PM-5:30PM

As the season comes to a close, it's time to look back and appreciate what's been grown in our garden, and observe as our hardest workers on the farm, pollinating insects, prepare for the winter. In this farm lab, we'll explore plants and pollinators under the microscope, and discover preservation techniques to keep what we grow around. From flower pressings, to slide preparations, bees to butterflies, there's so much to be explored and saved at the farm.

Come learn new skills or refine old ones at George Jones Farm! These workshops will include a learning portion, and a hands on activity, and all will come with a take home component.

DIY Lanternfly Traps | Friday, June 12th, 5PM-7PM

Have you started to see the Spotted Lanternfly (SLF) around? These invasive critters are in Ohio, and can cause major damage to our native plants and agriculture. This workshop will teach you how to make your very own SLF trap with materials you probably already have lying around. We'll also discuss the ecology of invasive species, take a short hike to learn to ID invasive flora and fauna, and strategize how to remove invasive species at home.

Foundations of Fermentation | June 20th, 2PM-4PM

If you've been interested in learning the basics of fermentation, how it works, and taking a swing at making your own funky and fizzy beverages, this workshop is for you! We'll discuss how exactly fermentation works, and you'll get to try your hand at making mead, ginger beer, or kombucha! Take home all the knowledge, skills, and tools you need to start your own fermentation station, and a bottle or two of your very own creation.

Only guests 21+ will have the option of making mead.

Foraged Fiber and Dye | Saturday, July 11th, 10AM-2PM

Learn about local fiber and dye plants, including how to find, identify, and responsibly harvest native species. Spend the day taking a guided hike exploring the natural history of plants and animals used in textile production throughout our region's history, and try your hand at processing some of your own fiber! You'll leave with new skills, handmade crafts, and plenty of inspiration. We'll cover the basics of cordage making, natural dyes, Eco-printing, and other ways to create practical and artful items from materials around us.

Seed Saving from the Garden | Saturday, September 26th, 2PM-4PM

*Join us on the farm to learn how to harvest, save, and store your seeds for next season! We'll learn both wet and dry seed saving from garden veggies, and how to properly label, store, and germination test them. We'll also walk through the GJF wetlands, and learn how to responsibly find and harvest native seeds. All participants will take home a variety of seeds. **Dress prepared for walking throughout farm and fields.***

Hot Sauce and Ristra Making | Friday, October 1th, 5PM-7PM

We've been growing peppers from all around the globe this season, and its time to transform them. In this workshop we'll explore options for saving and utilizing the fruits of your harvest beyond the growing season. Try your hand at making your own hot sauce with fresh peppers and utilizing local vinegars, crush fresh pepper flakes, and string useful and beautiful ristras to dry your peppers on. We'll also discuss safely harvesting and handling hot peppers, plus learn the history of this crop and how to grow it next season.

The New Farmer Incubator

The New Farmer Incubator Program seeks to bridge the gaps created by historical barriers to land access by offering aspiring farmers the resources, mentorship, and support they need to succeed.

The program partners addresses challenges of isolation, the need to build hyperlocal ecological knowledge, and systemic obstacles to launching sustainable farming businesses in an environment that has deeply challenged even the most experienced small farmers.

City Fresh is partnering with academic and community leaders to ensure farmer success by sharing agricultural land and resources, an established distribution network, and above-market purchasing for farm produce.

Some of the resources NFI Participants have access to are:

- Irrigation systems to ensure efficient water management.
- A walk-in cooler for post-harvest handling.
- Tools for farming operations.
- Technical assistance for resource access and planning.
- Opportunities for farm volunteers.
- Established wholesale relationships, market access, and a robust customer base through City Fresh's distribution network.
- And more!
